<u>Legal Voice</u>, \$15,000 grant

Legal Voice pursues justice for all women and LGBTQ people in the Northwest, through groundbreaking litigation, legislative advocacy, and legal rights. Proposed by Act of Giving member Stephanie Gerding.

<u>Densho</u>, \$12,500 grant

Densho, the Japanese American Legacy Project, is a grassroots organization dedicated to preserving, educating, and sharing the story of World War II-era incarceration of Japanese Americans in order to deepen understandings of American history and inspire action for equity.
